Top Takeaways:

- **Fire Safety Plans are no longer just a code compliance document,** but more of a road map and tool for building owners to achieve and maintain compliance.
- **Fire Safety Plans must be approved by the AHJ** and must be fully reviewed and updated at minimum every 12 months.
- There is an increasing risk of reported fire incidents from lithium-ion batteries. Follow best practices for battery charging and managing equipment in buildings.
